### UW Whitewater vs. UW Platteville

**Pre-Game:** It should be a fun matchup as the 17th ranked Whitewater Warhawks faceoff against the Platteville Pioneers Wednesday night. The Warhawks are coming off a commanding victory against Platteville in Bo Ryan court last week, 74-47. Expect Whitewater to get many points from the bench and dominate from three-point range as they did in the previous matchup.

**6:45 1st Quarter:** Jaya Perkins hits her 3rd three-pointer of the night to get her up to 11 points, scoring all of the Warhawks points thus far. Platteville responds with a three to make it 11-9.

**4:58 1st Quarter:** Media timeout, Warhawks up 13-9. Perkins has scored 11 of the Warhawks' points. She on fire from beyond the arc, not missing one three yet.

**End of First:** Warhawks with an authoritative quarter on the floor and hold a 24-11 lead. The recurring theme for the first quarter was turnovers, as the Pioneers committed nine of them in the first 10 minutes. The Warhawks managed to capitalize on just about every one of those turnovers.

**2:17 2nd Quarter:** Pioneers foul Malia Smith and Warhawks get two points off an inbound pass under the hoop. Platteville has turned the ball over far too many times, and the Warhawks have been out-rebounding them completely.

**End of 1st Half:** The Warhawks dominated the first half and lead the Platteville Pioneers 45-29 at halftime. Platteville seemed to struggle immensely at both ends of the court; they gave up a whopping 17 turnovers while letting the Warhawks get 17 offensive rebounds. Platteville will need to come back in the second half with a better mindset and take advantage of their offensive possessions.

**4:19 3rd Quarter:** Warhawks lead 58-36 after the rebounding and turnovers continue to pile up for the Pioneers. The Warhawks haven't exactly been as efficient as they were in the first half, but they still control the game.

**End of 3rd Quarter:** Andrea Olson hit a two-point jumper at the buzzer to extend the Warhawks lead to 66-38. Whitewater controlled the floor once again, taking advantage of Pioneer turnovers and offensive rebounds. The Pioneers did not shoot well from the field, and the turnovers aren't helping the team.

**6:30 4th Quarter:** The Pioneers have hit back-to-back three-pointers, and though the deficit is still significant, they've turned their game around well.

**4:58 4th Quarter:** After two free throws from Brooke Trewyn, the Warhawks are up 73-51. Platteville coach Megan Wilson is visibly frustrated with the number of turnovers and lack of made field goals, and it seems the possibility for a comeback is almost gone.

**Final:** The Warhawks closed out their game strong, winning 85-58. The Hawks improve to 18-4 and get a big conference win, closing in on the Oshkosh Titans, who place in first. The Warhawks closed out the final half shooting 55% percent from the field and ruled from just about the entire court. The Hawks will take on UW-Stout on Saturday at 3 p.m.
